Our Horticulture Program Continues to "Grow"

Students in our Horticulture Program always receive hands-on learning opportunities in the disciplines of science and health education with their involvement in the gardening program from seedling...to harvesting...to eating various vegetables, herbs, and fruits. Together the students planted over a dozen different vegetables and herbs this past year!

They harvested a bumper crop of cucumbers early on which were shared with our dining hall as well as students and their families. The students grew fresh dill and made 3 large crocks of delicious dill pickles--a lean and healthy snack still being enjoyed by students. Sacks full of zucchini, kale, Swiss chard, and various herbs were shared with cafeteria staff who transformed them into delicious dishes served with lunch and dinner entrees...YUM!

The horticulture program harvested bushels of delicious peaches, tart cherries, and some golden delicious apples from our established fruit trees. These have been enjoyed fresh by students daily! Surplus fruit has been cleaned, sliced, and frozen to enjoy later this winter when classes make pies and smoothies. Peaches were provided to our new Café work site to supplement their smoothie menu!

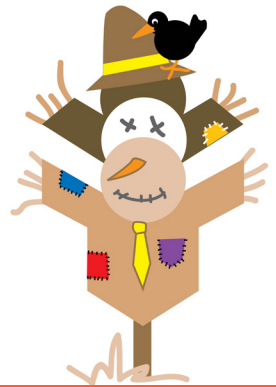
We are thrilled to report that our orchard is continuing to grow, thanks to the kind donation of 10 new fruit trees this past spring...thanks, Aon!

Allendale Students Participate in Outdoor Adventure Program

Allendale students participated in an “E” Adventures program with 8 other neighboring schools. Students rotated through 5 outdoor adventure disciplines: Tomahawk Throwing, High Skeet Archery, Sling Shots, Cross Bow, and Compound Bow. At each station trained Adventure staff demonstrated and instructed the students on proper safety and technique. Allendale students were awarded “Most Attentive” while receiving safety instructions!

A safe and encouraging atmosphere was provided for the students to experience outdoor activities they have never been exposed to in the community. Students were allowed to practice for 10 minutes and then start a competition where their score was recorded. Overall the students thought that the activities were amazing! They were challenged and had to utilize teamwork skills to earn a combined score for the group. After the competition the students were invited to a picnic where they had the opportunity to socialize with other teams and discuss the 5 outdoor adventure activities.
